Etrog – citrus fruit

Aravot – willow tree branches with leaves.

Hadasim – branches with leaves from the myrtle tree.

Schach – the roof covering.

Hoshanah – Last Day of Sukkot.

Hallel – Psalms 113 – 118 telling the whole of Jewish history.
